Abnormal Urinary Symptoms	Recommend seeing a Urologist for further prostate evaluation regardless of the PSA level (blood test) results. However, wait to schedule an appointment until you receive your blood test results. The results of your blood test will help your physician to determine further evaluation.
BPH	This is an enlargement of the prostate and only needs treatment when you have problems voiding. You will need further evaluation if the PSA level (blood test) is elevated.
